The mechanic who repaired our Escape also loaned us one of his vehicles free of charge during the two months we were without the use of our vehicle. We are so grateful for God's protection and provision for us.

I'm sure you have seen on the news that many Central Americans are making their way to the United States in search of a better life. A Few months back I wrote about a young man named Isaac that had returned to church after several years, and had brought his whole family with him. Sadly he also was hooked into making the trip north with an extended family member. He had wanted to attend Bible school at a Bible institute in the southern part of Honduras, but his father encouraged him to pursue a career in sports which seemed more lucrative than pastoring a church. His father is now grieving over Isaac's decision to go to the United States and wishes instead he had encouraged Isaac to study for the ministry.

In spite of our disappointment about Isaac, we have seen God's hand at work in the life of another young man. Omar is from Mexico but lived in the States for several years. He fell in love via the Internet with one of the young ladies that attends our church. A few months ago he came to Honduras to marry Cindy. During the premarital counseling sessions, I realized that Omar was trusting in his own good works to save him. I was able to share with him from the Bible Christ's finished work on the cross to pay our debt. He too realized that he was very religious, but not forgiven, and prayed to receive Christ as his Savior. Omar and Cindy are planning to get married next month.

This past week I had the opportunity to visit an elderly lady named Catalina in the hospital. Two months ago she was run over by a bus and has been hanging between life and death. A family member contacted me to ask that I visit her and share the Gospel message. We are so grateful that Catalina, the young lady assigned to take care of her, and the other patient in her room all prayed to receive the gift of eternal life. How incredible it is to see the Holy Spirit at work drawing people to Himself.
