He testifies that after leaving a party of drinking and drugs, walking on the white line of a busy highway, he was wanting to just step infront of a semi and he says that's when God got hold of him. He has been coming to church regularly, spending hours in the scriptures and listening to preaching that I or another brother has recommended. One that once was very hard and rebellious, is now very tender-hearted and weeps often. The church has really stepped up in trying to disciple him. For over two decades, he was a drunkard and drug addict. We earnestly ask that you put him on your prayer list, that through Christ, he will overcome those temptations that Satan haunts him with. He got his drivers license back all on his own, paid his fines, etc. and has been working some with Brother Cody who has just been saved a little over a year. It's been a blessing to me to see how God, in His great wisdom, has orchestrated this opportunity for both of them. As I asked previously, I deeply desire your earnest, effectual prayers in how to be used of the Lord in Michael's life. He has been reaching out to many of his old partying friends and telling them about Jesus. Michael told me one day that he used to be "the boss" and they all used to follow him. But now he said, "Jesus is my King and I follow Him." There is a great potential for God to use his testimony to reach many of those he once ran with to be saved. Please pray for his protection, for courage and strength to truly follow the Lord and not fall into any traps or snares of the enemy.

We all rejoiced this past Sunday morning as an answer to many prayers came through the door and found a place on a pew beside his dear, godly wife. Sister Ruth is a dear, praying saint and at 81, battles often with health issues; fainting and falling. She has a heavy burden, along with us the church, for her husband of 80+ years old who is known to most as a grumpy, old man. Please pray for Wilburn Wilson to be saved before it's too late. There are numerous others on our heart. The Lord knows each one. Multitudes are lost all around us.
