Something that you need to know about Doyle is that he was an openly gay man. I had witnessed to him the last time he was at the prison and although he admitted to me that he knew the Bible was true and that he would die and go to hell, he said that he did not want to quit what he was doing. This time was different. As I began to witness to him, he began to break down and cry. He said that he knew he needed to be saved and that he did not want to be gay anymore. I showed him the Romans road and he bowed his head and called on Jesus to save him. Since that day he has been faithful to church and has let people know that he is saved and not the man he used to be. Please pray for him that he will continue to grow in the grace and knowledge of our Lord and Saviour.
