Greetings from Bequia, our hope is that this letter finds you well. The past few months have been challenging ones but filled with encouraging moments. I recall a brother standing and testifying some week back during our morning service. His neighbor who attends our church would constantly invite him to come. To which he would genuinely respond, sometime. As he stood there, he admitted that he would leave home early Sunday morning, so he wouldn't have to deal with her. That one morning he drove past the church to work on the piece of land he owns and could not drive past the building on his way back down, he parked the vehicle while on the hill and listened. Weeks after he had a near death experience and immediately recognized it is God that was pleading with him to come back to Him. It's so much better when he tells it, but a blessing I wanted to share, nonetheless. Christians keep telling.

In the past months we have had multiple street and gospel tent meetings. It is great to see some of our fellow churches have street meetings in their respective areas as well. Keep us in prayer as we continue with the every village project, preaching the gospel in every village in this country. We have seen several people saved and in church learning and serving. Our desire is to plant churches in some of these areas. To this end, one of our brothers have a team coming in the month of July to assist with a church plant, in a village called Layou. Please be in prayer for these efforts.

In April we hosted a tent meeting in conjunction with a fellow church on mainland Saint Vincent. The morning was geared towards our local pastors, to be a help and encouragement to them. The nights were evangelistic meetings. On that last morning session, I believe a massive area of failure came to the forefront, one that could not be ignored. In all the churches represented, they were at least sixty years plus in existence, some as old as eighty and ninety, but not even one of these churches have started another Church of like faith anywhere on the island in all these years. There is a great deal of comfort that exists outside of the great commission and that seems to be the order of the day. Comfort seems to be more compelling than the great commission today. So, pray with us that not just us three men would be involved but all our brethren here in this country could rise and make an impact for Christ. With multiple street meetings every month, we need your prayer, please pray.

The ministry in Bequia have largely focused on getting the gospel out these last months. Because of it, God continues to bless and add to His church. For the first time since being in Bequia I would like to boost in God that we were able to have our first men's meeting this month. Pray for our men, God have much for them to do. There still is no word on the document needed for the land, naturally we continue to look to God and trust in His timing. As for my family, at the beginning of the month of June we received another two years' extension on our residence applications, it helps but our heart desire still is to receive permanent residence.
