## Chip Stowe - Director, Fundamental Baptist Home Missions

Dear Supporters and Friends,

I have returned from my trip to Honduras and it was all that I had hoped for (and more). The trip was very productive. I had several goals for this trip. I planned to preach and teach and also to meet many of our men serving in Honduras face to face and survey their works that are going on there. I wanted to visit the Alpha & Omega Children's Home, and I also wanted to meet the mayor of Sonaguera and the Minister of Education to talk about the Honduras Bible Project that I have been heavily involved in.

I preached in ten churches there and Angi taught in 7 bible clubs. I had the privilege to preach on live television and radio. We had dozens saved while we were there. The first night in Sonaguera, I met with the mayor and minister of education and presented them each with a plaque for their involvement in mandating that every school child in Sonaguera receive a bible. I talked with them about plans to continue the project in the surrounding municipals. I also was asked to speak at the meeting that the teachers had regarding the new school year. I was able to share the gospel from the "Book of all Books" and was well received. Afterwards, the teachers shared testimonies about how the Bible Project has affected them, the classroom, the students and how it is changing their country. What a blessing it is to be involved in this project.

I was able to go into the prison in Tela, Honduras. This was a surprise because we were told that we would not be allowed to do so...But God ...worked it out. We were able to go in, tour the prison, give out bibles, and sing with and preach to the prisoners...Praise God! On our last full day in Honduras, we visited the A&O Children's Home and were thrilled to get to spend some time with the kids and workers there. I would love to include all the pictures from our trip but obviously cannot. If you are interested in looking at some of them, you can see them on Angi's face book page at Angi Stowe.

I am so thrilled that I got to spend time with many of the FBHM missionaries, who serve in Honduras. These are true men of God. Each of them are pastoring 2 and 3 churches and mission works, plus they preach on the radio and television. They are busy for the Lord and are truly doing the work. I spoke with them about their goals and their needs, they are many. I am going to list them on the back of this letter and I beseech you to seek the Lord about helping meet these needs. They range from small to great and each one is a true need and worthy of your help. These would be great projects for you Sunday School classes or church to take on. I praise the Lord for allowing me to be involved with this work, to know these men, and to help them in every way that I can. I would love to come and present the ministry and share the works with your church. If I can be of any help to you, let me know.

- Samuel Amaya—This 27 yr. old man of God needs increased support. He is pastoring 3 churches/ mission works and he only has \$300.00 per month to support himself and 4 younger siblings. His church needs \$450.00 for a projector. \$500.00 to set up a pig pen in order to generate food and income for his family. A truck to transport them to the mission work in Sastre because he only has a motorcycle and has to go alone to minister there. Pray that he can come to the US to present his work.
- Josue Andrade—\$4351.81 to build classrooms which will be used for school and Sunday School at the back of the church in Sonaguera. \$50.00 per month for the radio broadcast (reaching 18,000 people) and \$50.00 per month for the television broadcast (3 times per week, reaching 50,000 people). Pray for the safe delivery of his baby girl, the cost will be \$1000.00. \$350.00 to build Sunday School class rooms in the church at El Coral. \$17,000 for A mini-bus to transport people to church.
- Ernesto Andrade—increased support.
- Carlos Estrada—Project of a music school from a distance. The idea is to record one or various DVD's to teach doctrinal and theory/practical instrumental music to each church that needs it. Estimated project is \$10,000 dollars for the professional recordings of Audio and Video and the logistics of the project.
- Napoleon Flores—\$10,000 more (they already have \$10,000) to buy an unplotted piece of land for the church.
- Carlos Gomez—\$1400.00 for a motorcycle to travel to the mission works. Property in the mountain to build a church building. Pray for his upcoming wedding in August.
- Henry Gomez—\$900.00 to finish the church in the Mt. of Politron (blocks, doors, windows). \$200.00 to get electricity in the church at Tosca. Also, they need \$2800.00 to build a Sunday School room at the church of Tosca, this will also help his family because they will be able to stay there overnight because it is very dangerous to travel there after dark. He has a motorcycle that needs repair at a cost of \$150.00. He also has personal needs so he needs more monthly support.
- Honduras Bible Project— money for bibles in public schools. 24,000 bibles have already been sent and this project is ongoing. It costs .50 per bible to ship them to Honduras.
- Carlos Ochoa—money to build a church building, money for bus repairs, monthly support.
- **A&O Children's Home**—Continued support, money for repairs to the home. Increase in the support of the workers there; **Mr. Zavala, Mario Zavala, and Daniel Zavala and their families**.
- Rene Rodriquez—He needs an increase in his support to help meet his personal and family needs.
- Axil Urbina—church bus to transport people to church, a vehicle to travel to the mission works, doors and window bars to secure the church building for the mission work in Toyos. Money to buy property and build a building for the church in San Juan Pueblo.
- Chip Stowe—I would love to come and present the work in your church. Increase in personal support.
