Hello from St. Thomas,

It has been a while since I last touched base with you. What a time to be alive! In the midst of the chaos, God is faithful. My family and church are doing well post hurricanes Irma and Maria.

These hurricanes tore through the island leaving us dazed for a while but with God's help and strength, we have cleaned up, thrown out, cut off as needs be and trying to get back on our feet. Everyone was affected in some way, some lost everything they owned. Personally, my family was displaced for some time but we have since found an apartment. I lost my truck that I used for work. Not only were we affected, but my homeland Dominica, was severely battered by hurricane Maria. My parents lost their roof and were displaced for some time. This led to a trip to Dominica in December for one month to repair their house and build a new roof. It has been an extremely challenging time but God gives grace.

The church building suffered minimal structural damages but volume of water coming through the property like a river for months left us with major expenses. The parking lot has to be redone and the fencing was also broken somewhat. We also lost the church van. Overall, gratefulness to the Lord continues to pour from our hearts because we have life and we have hope in the Lord. It could have been worse so we continue to give God the glory for the amazing things he has done.

We are continuing to believe God to grow the work in numbers and to see believers become more committed to the work of the ministry. Workdays continue every Saturday as we try to complete the fellowship hall, and do the necessary repairs.
