Hold the Ropes

"You hold the ropes while I go down", It was this that William Carey, the father of modern missions, pleaded with Christians as he set sail from England for India in 1793.

The following is a true story:

One day the people of New Brunswick, heard the wail of the siren which indicated that someone was in distress down on the shore of the Bay of Fundy. A great crowd rushed to the embankment and discovered the little Tom Mundy, who was playing on a rock, was now surrounded by the quickly rising tide. It seemed as if the onlookers could do nothing but wring their hands in despair as they listened to the cries for help from the little boy. The men had gone in the fishing boats for the day, but young Fred Allen came to help. But what could he do? The women shouted to him to try and do something. Fred did something, he secured a rope, tied it tightly about his body, shouted to the people to hold it and to pull when he gave the signal. As he slipped into the water, the people cried, "go on, go on, God bless you, we will help you." Then breathlessly they watched Fred as he fought his way to the Rock and little Tom. A loud cheer went up from the crowd, for now they knew all was well for little Tom; he would be saved.

That cheer was short lived. Fred turned and gave the signal for help. But they had forgotten to hold

the rope. The wind and waves had swept it into the bay, and they could do nothing about it, they stood watching in horror as Tom and his would be savior perished in the angry waves. The monument erected in the town square is a tribute to Fred's heroism, but a reproach to those who failed to hold the rope. The crowd had meant well but had failed to keep their promise. The tragedy was a result of their carelessness.

Our missionaries have gone down into the depths. Friends and home all forsaken, they have gone to "rescue the perishing." They have been sent on their way with many wishing them God's blessing and promising to pray for them and support them. Are we standing by in watchful prayer, or are we allowing the rope to slip from our grasp? The success or failure of their work depends on how we "hold the rope."

Greetings, once again in Jesus Name. We have just finished up our 35th annual Jubilee here in the States in July. It was a great time of fellowship and preaching. It was good to see many of you there.

Since June we have been carrying some of our men from the Islands around to meetings here in the States. I want to say thank you to each Pastor that had these men in to

preach for you. Also thank you to those of you who voted to partner with them in their fields of service. We are very thankful for all you do for them and us as we serve the Lord together.

In April and May, Becky and I were in the Islands of Grenada, Barbados, St. Vincent and Bequia. We were there 31 days and visited 11 of our men. We preached in many of their Churches and were able to see what God is doing there. It was a blessing to us to see God moving in the lives of His people, and see the many ministries going on. I preached in a Tent Meeting and Juvenile Center, as well as the Radio besides the Church Services. It was a blessed time for us to be a small part of what God is doing there.

I want to focus on two men. First, Brother Adrian Massiah, he is on the Island of St. Vincent. Several of you met him while he was here at the Jubilee. They are starting an Early Child Care Center at the Church next month. His ministry deals a lot with the young people there as they are trying to reach them for Christ. One great need they have at this time is a bus. They have been saving for this for about 4 years and have about half of the needed funds. I know several Churches gave to them while they were here to help purchase this bus. If you could help with this, it would be used for God's glory there in the Island. We have a group wanting to go there next June to help with VBS. If you would desire to help with this need you can contact me or the Mission Board.

I would like to focus second on Brother Iliobert Destine from Haiti. He is working with 32 Churches there and almost all of them are meeting under trees: 3 are around Port-Au-Prince and 28 in Province of Haiti and one in Dominican Republic. He is needing about \$7000.00 dollars to fix their building that was damaged by the Earthquake. He was telling me that they slept outside for a while for fear of another Earthquake. If you would feel lead to help with this need you can contact me or Brother Chip Stowe at the Mission Board.

Our Island Jubilee for 2018 will be held in St. Vincent. The dates are April 3-10, 2018. Mark your calendar and plan to join us there for some good preaching and fellowship.
